Her lecture material includes teaching students how to use Geographical Information Systems (GIS) to create habitat suitability maps and setting up data to perform corridor analyses. The field courses involve training students to identify wildlife sign through formal tracking methods. The data analysis courses teach students how to download collected GPS data into GIS and analyze the data for wildlife movement patterns. All courses involve working with student groups in forming wildlife coalitions and facilitating meetings.
