

Wildlands is a national leader in mitigation and conservation banking with projects throughout the western U.S. Established in 1991, Wildlands is one of the Nation's first private organizations to establish banks protecting wetland and wildlife habitat in perpetuity, including the first wetlands mitigation bank in the western U.S.; the first fisheries mitigation banks for Chinook salmon, steelhead, and Delta smelt; and the first conservation bank for federally listed vernal pool species.

Wildlands has implemented over 75 large-scale restoration, mitigation, and conservation projects working toward the mission "to create a legacy of thriving and protected natural habitat through ecologic and economic cooperation."
